## Redistricting Process

Map Adoption December 12, 2023	Two Draft Map Hearings Nov. 14 & Dec. 12	Release Draft Maps November 7, 2023	Initial Hearing October 24, 2023	Step
Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption. Map adopted via resolution	Two Public Hearings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.	Release of draft map options online	Held prior to release of draft maps.  Education on process and review of current Zones.	Description








### Green Map




- Uses current boundaries to the extent possible
- Zones 1, 4, and 5 retain their eastern and western extents
- Zones 2, and 3 include most of Clearlake – Zone 4 is no longer in Clearlake

### Orange Map




- Uses major roads and city borders
- Keeps Hidden Valley Lake whole in Zone 5, Cobb and Middletown moved to Zone 4
- Uses major roads in Clearlake to divide zones

### Purple Map



- Maintains four Zones with a substantial part of Clearlake
- Uses existing precinct boundaries to the degree possible

### Yellow Map



- Keeps eastern Clearlake whole in Zone 3
- The lakefront itself is split three ways, removing Zone 3's portion.
- Zone 1 is mostly out of Clearlake proper, but Zone 4 has a more substantial part in the southwest of the city
