

## Every Beat Counts - Case for Cardiac Ultrasound Testing

Heart disease is the No. 1 cause of death in the United States for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups. Many people remain unaware of what a danger this condition poses to their health because there are usually no noticeable symptoms. Often people never find out they have heart disease until a heart attack, stroke or other cardiac event occurs.

In the last five years Lake County had 863 deaths caused by heart disease and stroke exceeding both the state and national rates. In the last three years, during the pandemic, these numbers have been climbing. Twelve percent of Lake County residents, 7,150 people or 1 in 9 people, are living with some type of heart disease.

Early detection of coronary heart disease is the key to preventing and treating heart attack and stroke. The Vivid S70N, powered by artificial intelligence, provides 3D imaging of the heart to support earlier diagnosis and medical treatment of heart conditions. The Vivid S70N is ultra-fast, ultra-precise and ultra-efficient, providing quicker exams and faster scan results. Currently, Lake County patients must travel out of the county to get these diagnostic services. Adventist Health Clear Lake is expanding our cardiac services to bring this innovative equipment closer to home for patients in Lake County.
